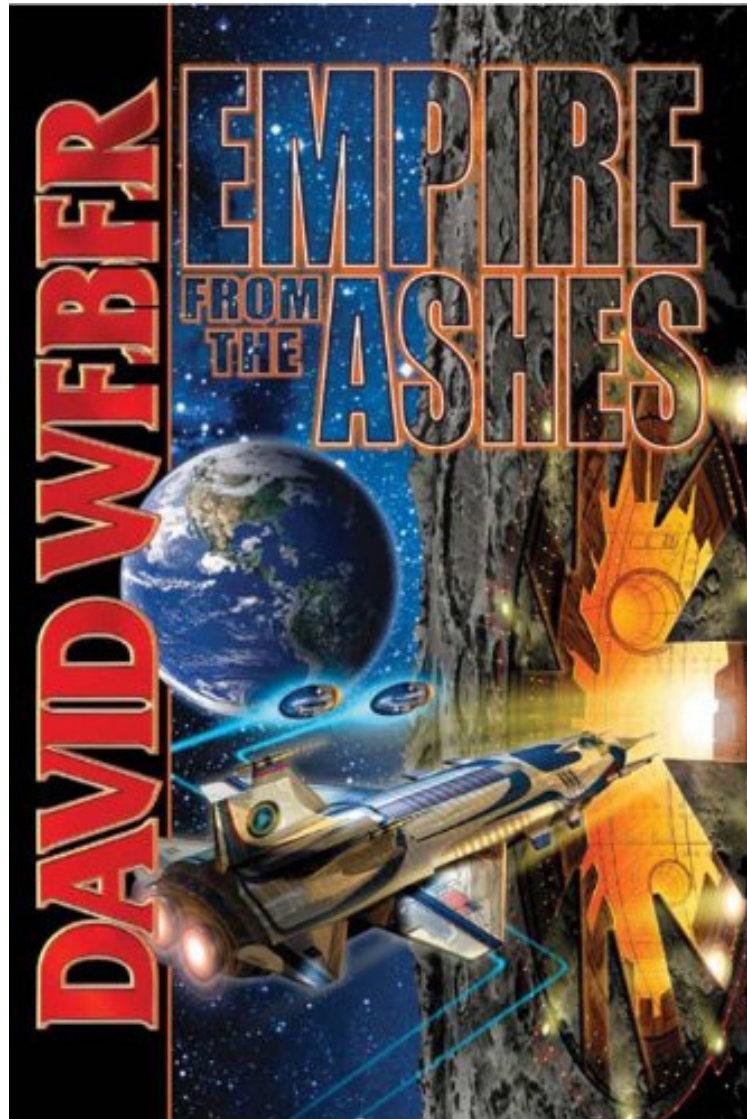

Die einzelnen Bnde sind schon vor Jahren als Taschenbcher in Englisch erschienen. "Mutineer's Moon" baut die Grundlagen des Dahak Universum auf. In diesem Buch wird die Hauptperson der Serie "Colin MacIntire" (Pilot einer NASA Testmission), bei einem Testflug um den Mond, von dem Raumschiff "Dahak" bzw. dessen Computer "Dahak" entfhrt, um als neuer Kommandant von Dahak zu fungieren. Dahak bentigt eine neue Mannschaft, um die Meuterei seiner Crew zu beenden, die von fnfundfnzig tausend Jahren geschah und der Gefahr fr alle belebten System durch die Achu'ultanii zu gegengen. Die Meutere sind seit dieser Zeit auf der Erde gestrandet. Der Kampf gegen die Meuterer ist der Plot dieses Romans. "The Armageddon Inheritance" beschreibt das Zusammentreffen der Streitkrfte der Erde mit den Schiffen der "Achu'ultanii". "Heirs of Empire" beschreibt die Zeit ca. zwei Jahrzehnte nach dem ersten Angriff der "Achu'ultanii", in der sich Colin MacIntire (inzwischen Imperator des Imperium aufgestiegen) gegen eine gezielten Verschwrgung zur Wehr setzen muss. In diesem Roman spielen Colin's Kinder und deren Freunde ein wichtige Rolle, nachdem diese auf Ihrer ersten Raumfahrt als Mitglieder der Raumstreitkrfte einen "kleinen" Unfall haben. Da diese Serie nur Spa macht, wenn man die Bcher in der richtigen Reihenfolge liest, macht diese Zusammenfassung Sinn. Wie man es von David Weber gewohnt ist malt er seine Welt mit breitem Pinsel und setzt Mastbe an, die fast die Phantasie sprengen (Mond-groe Raumschiffe, Kriege die seit 10.000 Jahren andauern, etc.) und verleiht dem ganzen doch eine menschliche Variante, da man das ganze durch die Augen eines relativ normalen Mannes sieht, der mehr unabsichtlich als sonst in die Sache hineinstolpert.
