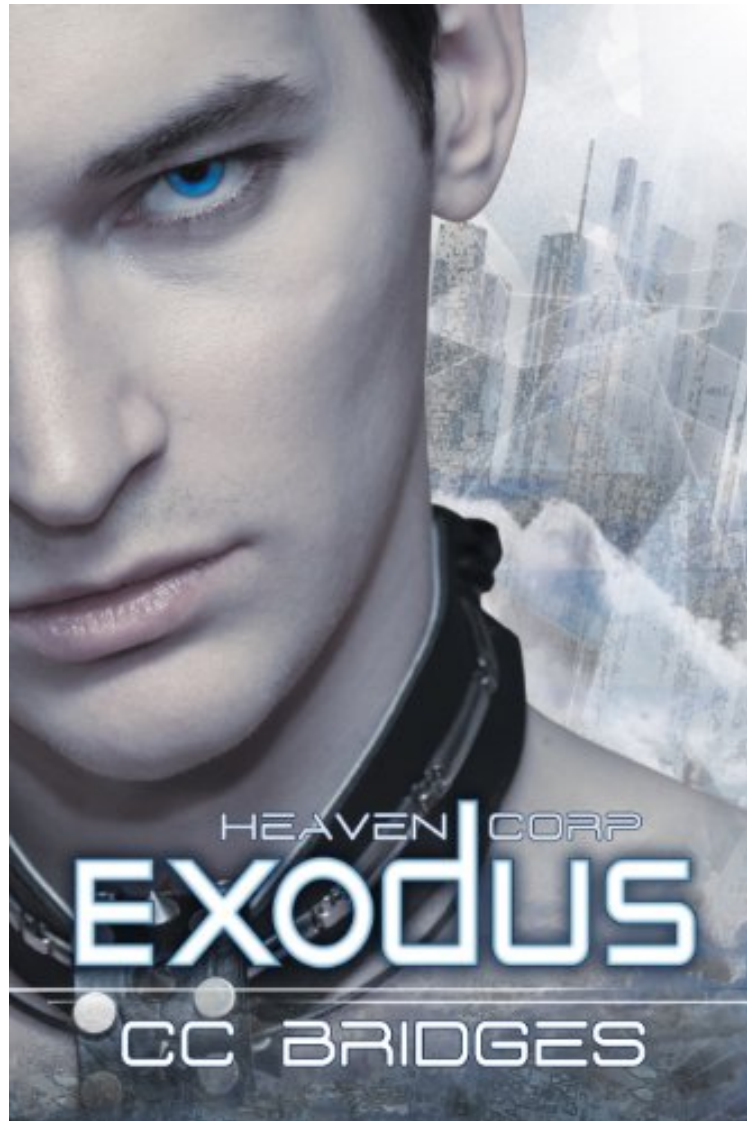

Still an exciting and fun read, but not as strong as the first novelVon Juniper GreenIt's been four years since Angel 1089 was published and thanks to the God AI, finally here's the second novel of the Heaven Corp Series. Exodus focuses on Hank and Ian, two characters already known and beloved from Angel 1089. The story sets in a few years before the events in the previous book and tells how Hank and Ian, a member of the Board families ruling Heaven and his former

bodyguard, came to live on devastated earth. Although you can read both novels independently, I would recommend reading Angel 1089 first, to get to know the setting. Exodus leaves open a few questions about the world and the city of Heaven which are already answered in the first novel. Well, first of all, I'm not a big fan of BDSM stories, just not my cup of tea; but I really liked Hank and Ian, I was really thrilled by the fantastic world full of cybernetic angels and demons that C.C. Bridges created in Angel 1089 and I just HAD to know more. The strong story of Angel 1089 took me by surprise, it felt sparkling, fresh, new. Exodus still has all the great ideas but Bridges fails to put anything new into it. The story focuses mainly on the relationship between Hank and Ian, the story itself seems to be of less importance. Of course, that is totally okay for a m/m story, but still left me a tiny bit disappointed. There are still a lot of strong points, though: The character development feels realistic and the chemistry between Ian and Hank is as great as expected. Especially Hanks development from a spoiled brat to a sympathetic young man was fun to read. The world building is still exiting: The city of Heaven with its contrasts between the old, dirty low levels and the posh upper levels of the Board families is sketched out great, the even starker contrast to the polluted and poor earth adds a gritty feeling to the story. Heaven, which is meant to be a sparkling promise to humankind, gets darker and less promising by the minute. Especially if your loves and desires don't fit into the Morality Laws. Still, for me the story lacks a bit of the magic of the first novel. Which could be due to the fact that the angels only play a minor role in Exodus. I missed these wings ;-). Plus some points would have deserved to be worked out in more detail: How do the families on the Board rule Heaven? What distinguishes Heaven from Texico and where exactly is Texico? Who or what is Metatron? What about these brain chips the children of Heaven got implanted? Well, there's still hope that the third novel will answer these questions. Anyway, Exodus is a fun read set in an interesting, exiting world with likeable characters. I'd give 3,5 stars that's not possible here, so let's make it 4. (please pardon any mistakes, I'm not a native speaker, I try my best.)
