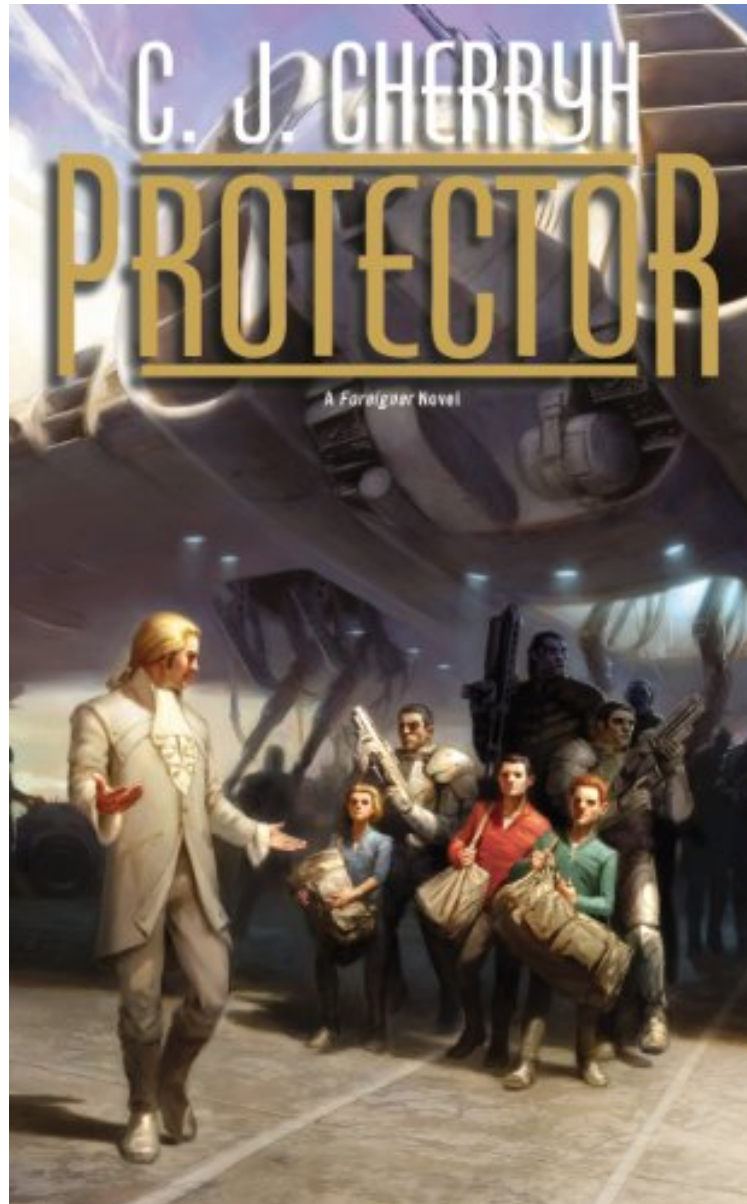

War ich im letzten Buch frustriert, dass Cajeiri's Einrichtung und neues Haustier das Interessanteste im Buch waren, whrend Bren's Geschfte sich grtenteils recht gezogen haben, sind diesmal alle seine diplomatischen Knste gefragt. Nur wre ich diesmal viel glcklicher damit gewesen, wenn sich das Buch lnger mit den menschlichen Gsten beschftigt htte. Was eigentlich der interessanteste Handlungsstrang im Buch ist, bekommt kaum Raum, weil so viele andere politische Aspekte geklrt und erklrt werden mssen (es hilft auch nicht, dass alles was zu der aktuellen Situation gefhrt hat zwei oder dreimal erklrt wird, als ob irgendjemand Buch 14 einer Serie als erstes lesen wrde). Aber davon abgesehen finde ich die neuen Charakter, die eingefhrt werden, interessant, zumal wir nun die Phase kennenlernen, die die Autorin bei Jason berspringen musste, die Phase, wenn ein Raumfahrer zum ersten Mal einen Planeten kennenlernt.
