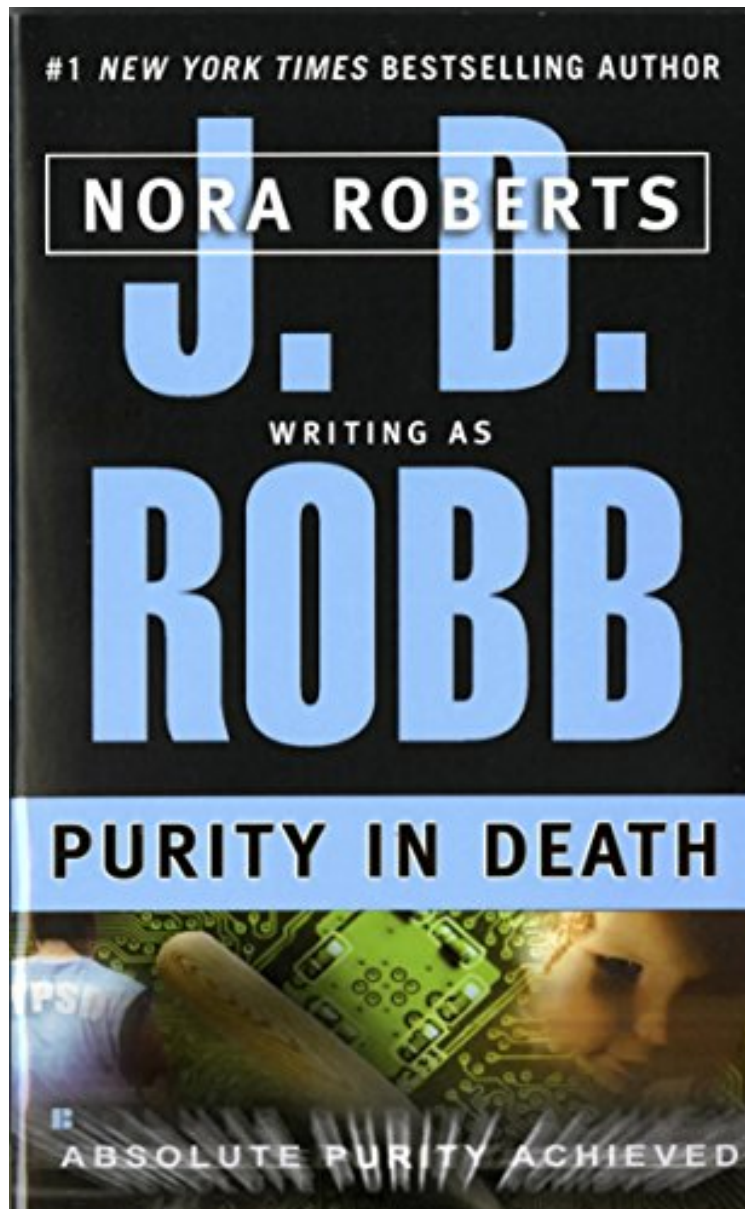

And they're not too worried about hurting innocent bystanders. So, the specialists trying to analyse the computers are in danger too, and among those are Roarke and McNab.
