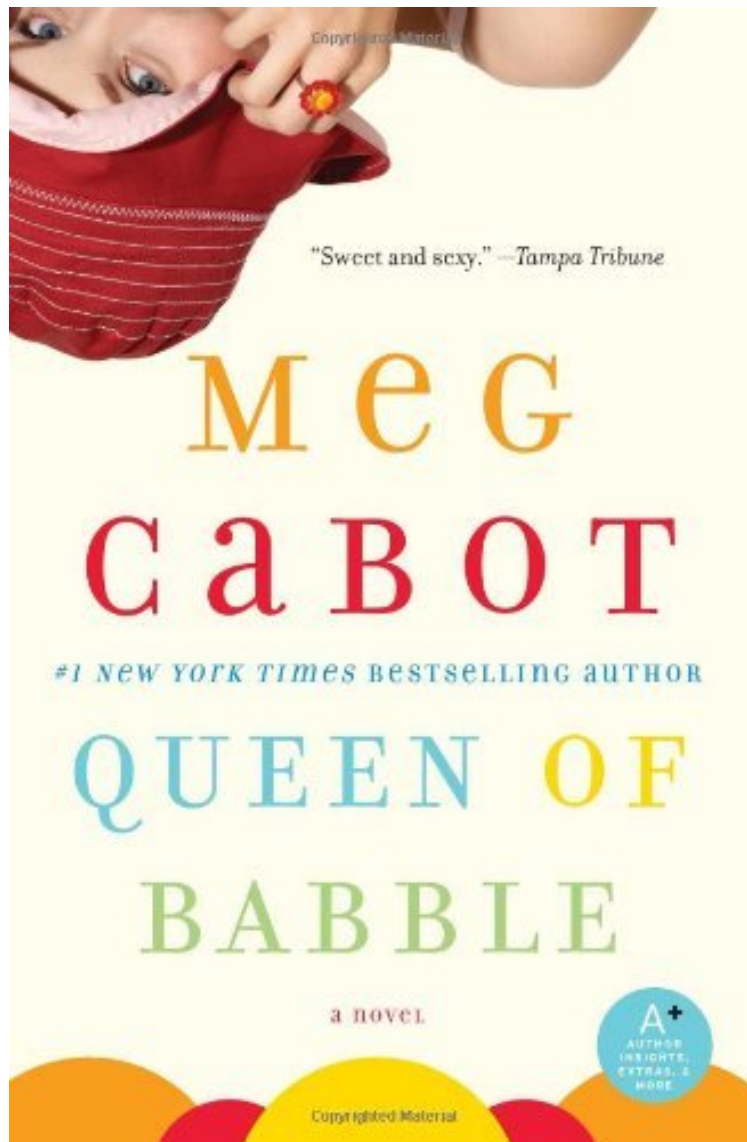

indeed Von Allegrissima The only good thing about this book is the title because it's absolutely appropriate. The narrator of this story really IS the "queen of babble". But in order to stand up to this title the author exaggerates so mercilessly that the result is unbearable. I think I have never before been forced to suffer a similarly stupid heroine. If Meg Cabot assumed to make the lead personality charmingly naive or chaotic in a loveable way, she failed completely. Lizzy is not charming. Lizzy is plain silly in a way that starts to annoy the reader from page 1. Who wants to listen to the question whether anybody can see that the heroine does not wear underpants or not? And of course the problem is not mentioned once but - as fit for a "queen of babble" - the worry goes on and on for pages... Please! The plot is rather thin and the author did obviously not really have any story to tell, so she made up for it with heaps of superficial rambling about shoes, clothes, make-up, weight loss and plastic surgery. The height of impudence are the excerpts of Lizzy's senior thesis about the history of fashion. Does the author really want us to believe that you can graduate from an American college with this kind of shallow babble???

The heroine, Lizzy, is really prattling, and it takes some time getting used to her rambling and her incredibly naive attitude towards her surroundings. Nevertheless, I liked her unique vision of fashion and vintage clothes and her undomitable courage after discovering the not-so-savory things about her idolized boyfriend, Andrew. The scenery of the chateau in France was another refreshing change to all the romances taking place in US, and I was also relieved there were no nearly-naked people on the cover, and that there was no sex scene every fifty pages. On the whole, for a light romance, it was entertaining and gave some aspects off the well-trodden paths, and I think it doesn't deserve so bad a recommendation.

Add to that the arrival of ex-beau Andrew, who's looking for "closure" (or at least a loan), and everything including Lizzie's shot at true love is in la toilette . . . unless she can figure out some way to use her big mouth to save the day.
