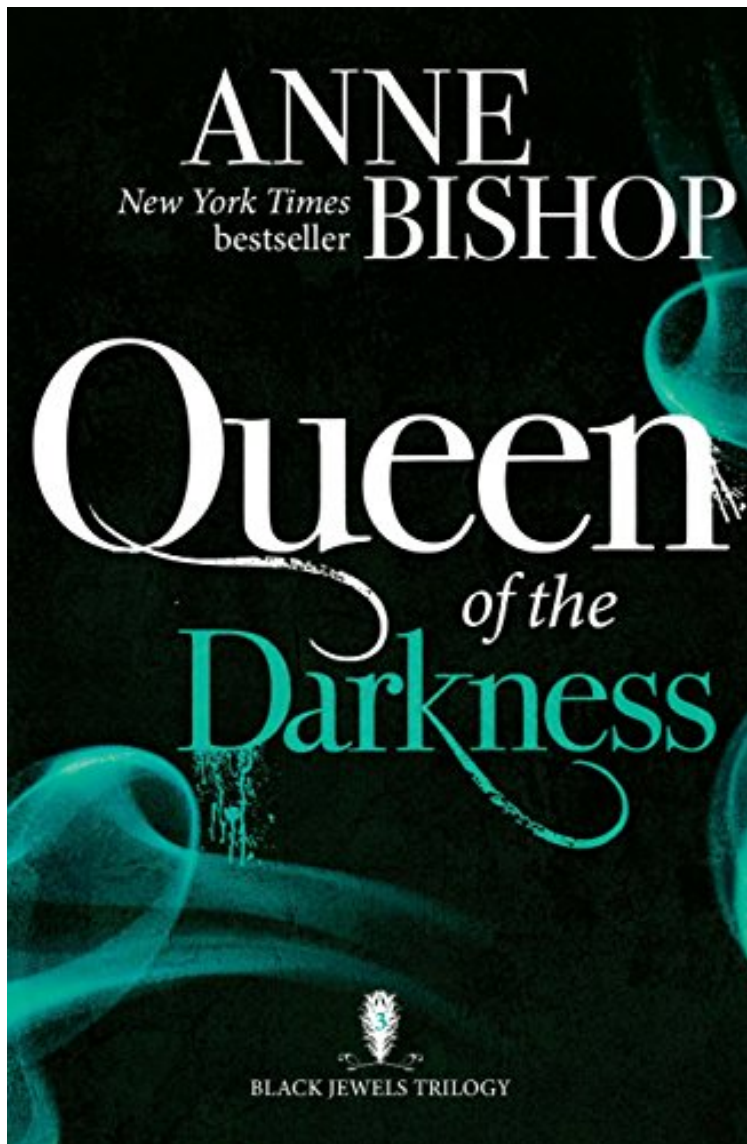

For the most part, Daemon was almost always great, except there were a few places where he seemed to be out of character, eg. those times when he was afraid of Lucivar and when he fainted. That didn't sound like him to me. Lucivar was great! His whole family is great. Jaenelle, sometimes she doesn't seem like the Jaenelle that was in the first two books, she's changed a lot when it comes to ruling and killing these days. Does anyone else think that the woman on the cover looks a little too old to be twenty five? Surreal is the best; she's funny and she's always picking fights with the guys in the family, for after an upset with her name, she's become family. Chaosti, Khardeen and Aaron were mentioned a lot in this book compared to the other two and we learn what happened to them, ie marriage, children etc. but there are some people that we just don't see any more, except for one line appearances, which was really confusing and annoying. There are so many new people and they're not described enough for people to remember them by. I loved the first 2 books, but Queen Of The Darkness left my "cold". The book was written well, all in all, but I noticed quite a few story lines that were simply dropped, storylines that could have been expanded to create a much more interesting and well-rounded book. I didn't get to see as much of the Sadist as I would have liked, and, although I appreciated his more sensitive behavior, Daemon's character stuck me as rather weak, exactly the opposite in the first two books. I also had a problem with the way she handled her more minor characters. Some of them she introduced well, and some of them just appeared, forcing me to have to look back in the first two books to see who she was talking about. (Not that I minded having to reread Daughter of The Blood, and Heir to the Shadows!) I would have been much more forgiving, had the ending had not been such an anti-climax. With such great first two books, one would expect the ending of the trilogy to be something spectacular, but at the conclusion of Queen of The Darkness, I was left on the edge of my seat, so to speak. I did love Lucivar and his family, and I had always wanted to see more of Surreal. I liked the way Briarwood was handled, and the development of Daemon and Jaenelle's love (especially the first kiss!) was great. I think that the clues found in the first two books were skillfully incorporated into the ending, even though I thought that they could have been a little more complex. I definitely think that the trilogy should be expanded. There is still so much to be done with these characters. What happens in the Dark Court after Dorothea and Hekatah are killed? How much of the blood survived? What will happen with Daemon and Jaenelle's union? How will this torn and bleeding world pull itself back together? As you can see, the ending of the trilogy left me with many questions.

Overall Review: If you read the first two books of the trilogy, then definitely read this one, but don't expect too much.
