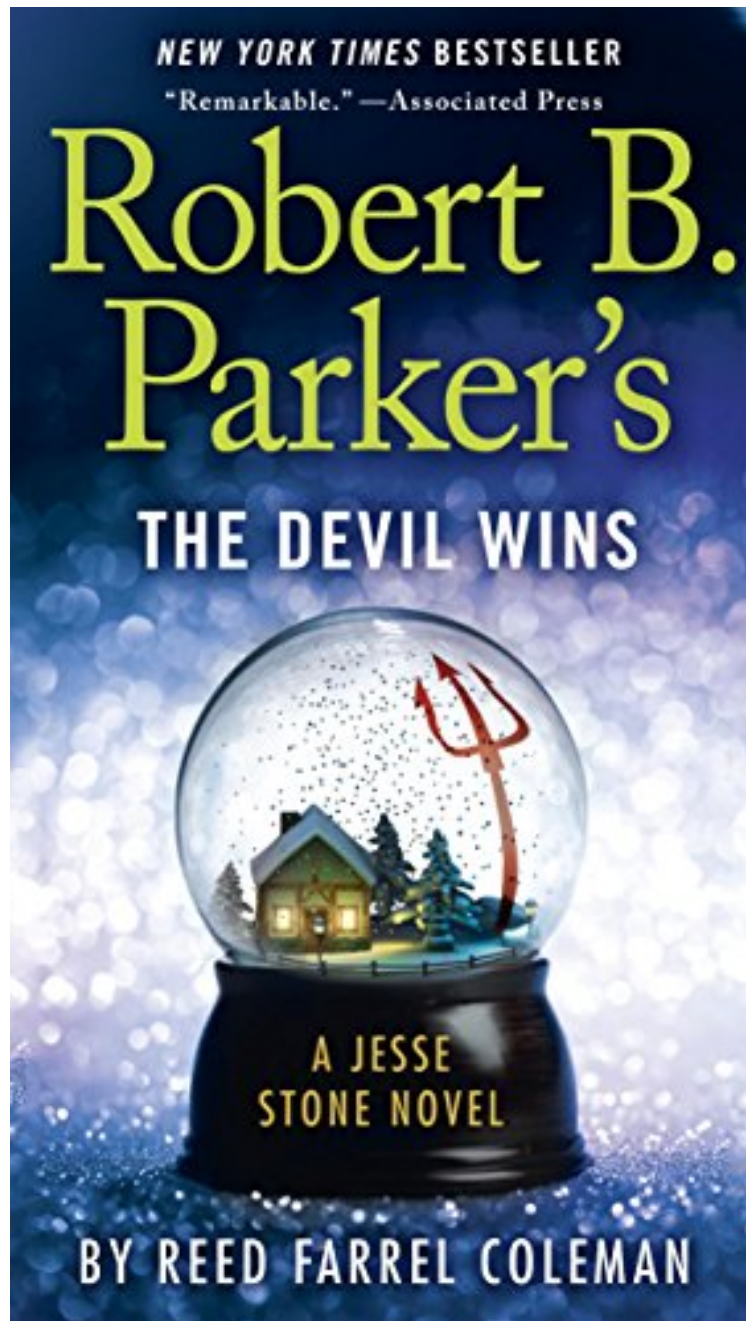

A man is murdered and his body left in an abandoned warehouse, his features so mangled that identification is impossible. There is an elaborate tattoo on his arm but it turns out to be untraceable. As the building is searched for clues, the skeletal remains of two teen girls are also found, they are identified as those of two girls that vanished without a trace decades ago. One of the girls was the best friend of Officer Molly Crane, so she experiences a resurgence of memories of her youth, clouding her judgement. In typical Jesse Stone style, there is a systematic examination of the case, with clue fragments being uncovered on a slow and steady basis. Sometimes the reader is aware that a clue just appeared and other times it is a distractor. Jesse also develops a new lady friend, Tamara Elkin, the local ME. At the beginning they agree to keep it a friends without benefits relationship, but enough hints are dropped to indicate that something more may develop. There are twists and turns with more people turning up dead and Jesse faces increasing pressure to solve all of the crimes, even being given an or-else deadline. I developed my single person of interest midway through the book and that turned out to be right. However, there were some surprises left for the last pages that were unexpected.
