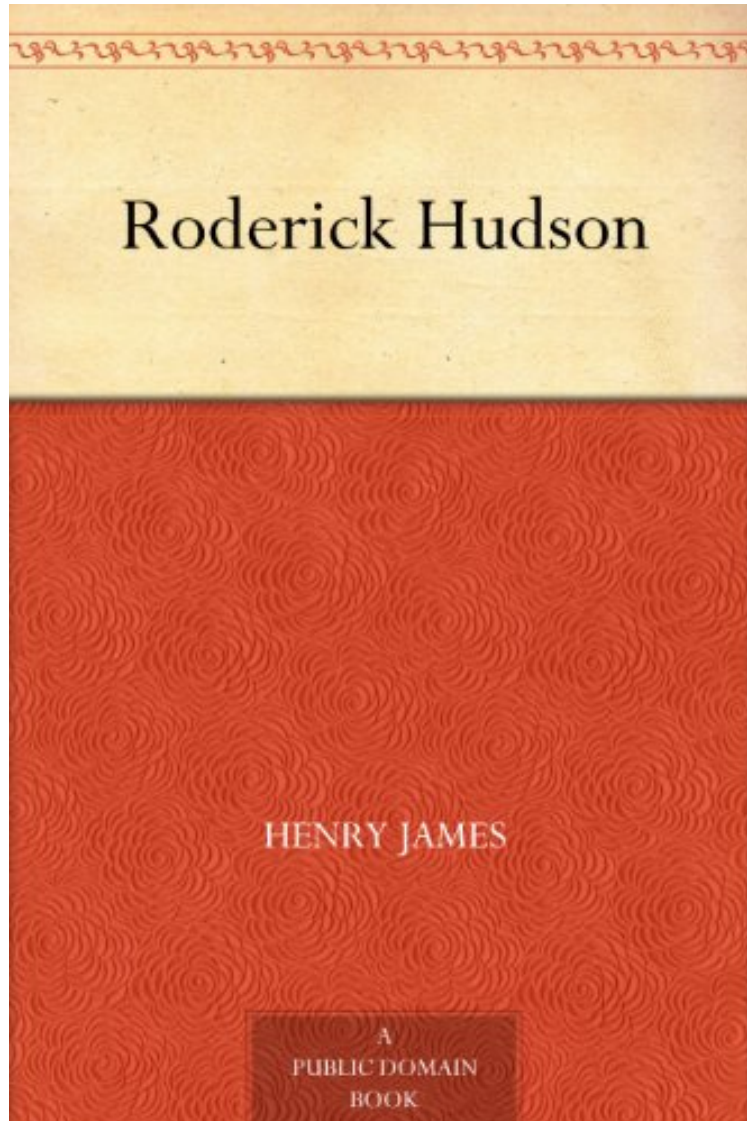

However, there is no information that this is the 1878 edition rather than the substantially altered (in my view, improved) New York edition of this first 'official' novel by James. The story in either

edition is worth reading, there are moments in the middle of the book where the plot drags and I found myself turned off, but otherwise this is great stuff and highly instructive for any writer who wishes to learn how to write about consciousness and go deeply into characters, which is one of James' strongest points and skills even in this early novel. The reluctance to like the later edition is widespread, I don't share it. A few examples, if you get the 1907 edition (e.g. from New Paltz) will show you the superiority of his developed style.
