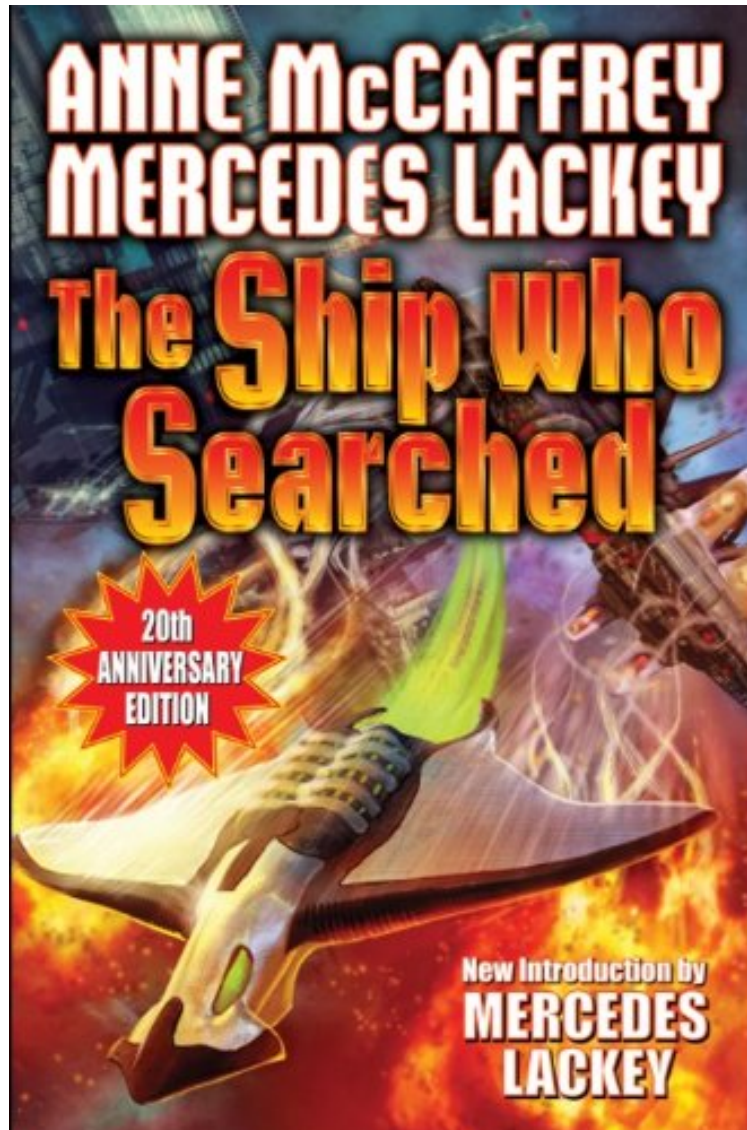

brainship, back in the early 1960s. The idea was that babies who were born deformed but had undamaged brains could be encased in titanium shells and have their minds joined with the computers of a starship. Working in tandem with a "brawn," a specially trained pilot, a "brain" could earn a living in space. By the end of the decade she had enough short stories to publish a collection called "The Ship Who Sang." A couple of decades later McCaffrey returned to the idea, this time working with Margaret Ball to produce "Partnership," a novel that was about a new shellperson, Nancia Perez y des Gras. Clearly McCaffrey was interested in exploring the concept of these brains in different way. That is certainly the case with "The Ship Who Searched," written with Mercedes Lackey. What is different about the "brain" in this third volume is that Hypatia Cade (commonly called Tia) was a normal child, who traveled with her archeologist parents on their expeditions. But then Tia became ill because of a mysterious illness, which renders her a quadriplegic leaving her brilliant mind in an inert body. However, her doctor, the famous Kennet Uhua-Sorg, is able to use his influence to get Tia a chance to enter the shellperson program, which the young girl accepts. This makes her the oldest human even to become a brainship, even though she is only seven years old. But unlike those that we have met before there is a critical difference here, because Tia remembers what it was like to run around and touch other people. For the parents of Helva and other shellpeople the choice was between euthanizing their child or letting them be trained to be half of a BB, whereas Tia has to make the choice for herself and live with the consequences of her decision. As XH-1033, Tia is paired with Alexander Joli-Chanteau as her brawn, and they prove to be compatible. He also happens to be interested in archeology, just like her parents, and he is more than willing to help her find the source of the disease that destroyed her body and which threatens other people as well. Of course that is a personal quest and Tia and Alex are obligated to do their jobs first and deal with smugglers, pirates and other space perils while keeping a lookout for clues about the mysterious illness. But this BB team are interested in doing more than just finding the cause of the disease; they want to make sure that nobody else becomes a victim of it. The character of Tia makes this the most interesting of the books in this series, in part because her situation is one that we can more easily imagine being in than what we read about Helva and Nancia. That justifies rounding up to make this one stand out in the series, but you really do have to read the first two to appreciate everything that is happening in this one.

Normalerweise werden nur Menschen ausgewhlt, die bei der Geburt starke krperliche Behinderungen haben, die ihnen ein normales Leben nicht erlauben. Diese werden dann von Geburt an fr diese Aufgabe ausgebildet. Tia ist ein vollkommen gesundes und vor allem intelligentes Kind, das wohl so jedem Erwachsenen mehr als das Wasser reichen kann. Achtung, mglicher Spoiler! Auf einer Expedition kommt sie aber mit etwas in Kontakt, dass ihre Krperfunktionen immer mehr lhmt/ausschaltet und so kann sie bald nur noch herumsitzen und nicht tun.

Alexander Ashlar (endymion@tm.net.my) In my entire life, I can count the number of books that have moved me to tears on the fingers of one hand. Those include luminaries such as Guy Gavriel Kay for his Lions of Al-Rassan and Fionavar Tapestry as well as Melanie Rawn for Skybowl. However, none of them had quite the impact of Hypatia's story. I am not ashamed to say that by the end of the first seventy three pages, I was in tears. The scenes, especially those in the hospital with her teddy bear were just so well written that I had to put down the book and wipe away the tears blurring my vision before I could continue. The sheer emotional impact of those scenes were so moving upon me. While I could have wished that the initial stages, especially those dealing with how Tia deals with the illness were a little more developed, this book is still certifiably Anne McCaffrey and Mercedes Lackey's best work to date.
