drohenden Vernichtung des Universums. Eine Handvoll Individuen, die ihre eigene Geschichte und Agenda haben, lassen es dabei ziemlich krachen. Klingt bel? Ja! Normalerweise hätte ich diesem Buch keinen Blick geschenkt, wurde aber durch andere Rezensionen neugierig. Als ich dann begann zu lesen, war ich schnell in den Bann gezogen. Es geht hier wirklich Schlag auf Schlag; hier wird nicht gekleckert, sondern geklotzt und dann noch einer draufgesattelt. Die Hauptcharaktere werden episch vorgestellt und sind alle miteinander schräg und cool. Dass z.B. der leibhaftige Luzifer auftritt und dabei nur eine kleine Nebenrolle hat, passt gut ins Bild. Der Autor traut sich in seinem Erstlingswerk wirklich eine ganze Menge, und auch da, wo er ein bisschen danebenhaut, wirkt das eher charmant und fällt in seinem Feuerwerk der Ereignisse nicht so ins Gewicht.
