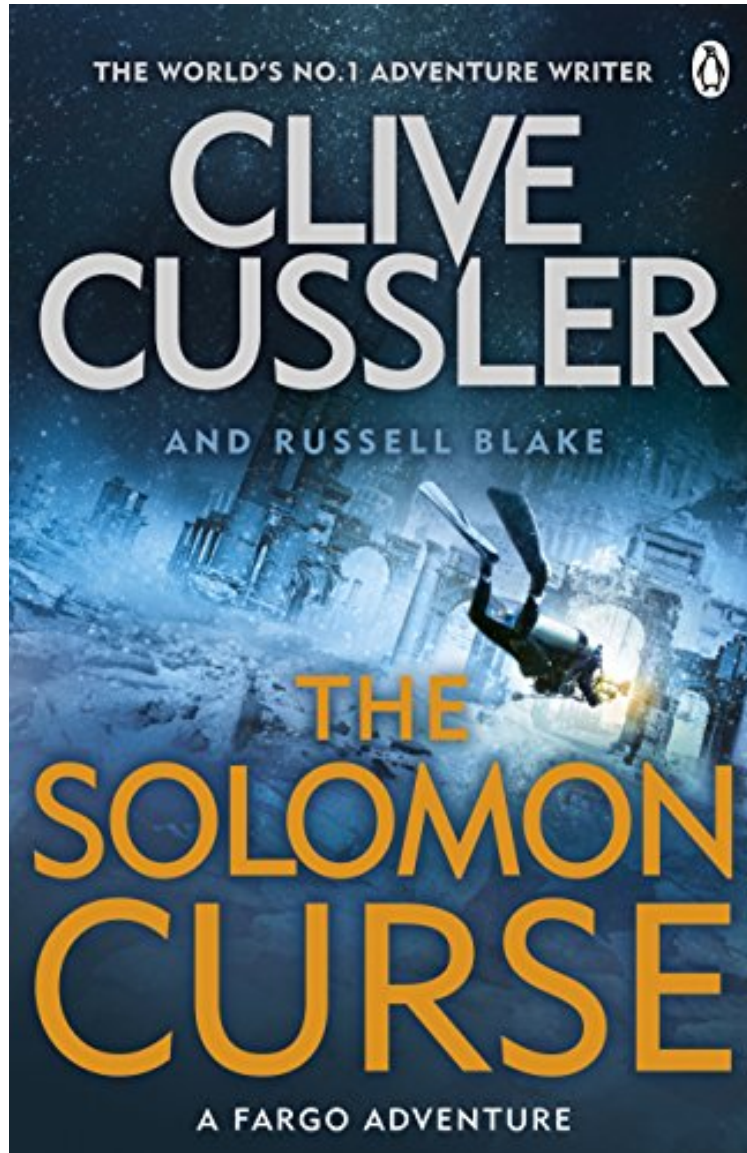

Not anymore.The Fargoes started out as somewhat predictable and as over the top impossible as Dirk Pitt, but they were fun to read nevertheless. The last 4 books in this series have been so bad, I am angry with myself for hoping against hope and buying anyway. I shouldn't have. I have read much better crafted fanfiction. There is no character depth in any of the people, good or bad. You don't even feel any anger towards the villain, because the book just doesn't make you care. The Fargoes seem to have lost all their initial character traits. Sam is afraid of a spider, Remi has become not only a simpering wimp, but an irresponsible one. There is nothing of the capable couple left, who followed an adventure and trusted in their love for each other and their respective skills to make it through. They don't want to solve a puzzle. It's all about "treasure". Used to be the treasure was the by-product of the overall story. But then, there is no overall story line - so there.The story itself is weirdly hopping around without any logic to it. Plot points are left hanging without being resolved. It is as if someone had found a recipe book and followed it: Car chase - check, weapons wielding villains - check, archeological mystery - check, present day implications - check (well, not so much, as the treasure was never on the agenda of the villian and didn't play any part in the story other than put our "heroes" on the spot)....I could go on, but what's the point. The (co-)author took the Cussler formula and tried to flesh it out, but sadly, lacks the writing skills to make it work. It feels hollow.I may just have to accept that Cussler still hasn't found anyone to continue his various series in a worthy manner. :(And I just have to mention it, even if it can be considered a spoiler: 17 feet giants? Seriously? That was the moment I threw the book away in disgust.This doesn't even deserve the one star, but I gave it because the basic idea behind it all was good and could have made a great book - in somebody else's hands.
