The basic plot details are already

summarized, so I won't repeat. The series deals with a period and location that weren't that familiar to me and, happily, are different from many other historical detective series. This genre is one of my favorites and Gil Cunningham's and his wife Alys's stories are an enjoyable addition to my bookshelves.
