pirates and I have to say: this one was not just way better but also downright good. Its well written, the protagonists are funny, witty and likeable and we see their relationship develop in a natural way (both inside and outside their bedroom). I especially liked that the topic of consent is taken seriously even in a same-sex-setting so the ugly trope of its not rape if a woman does it is consciously avoided. Besides the storyline revolving around the two major characters theres also a plot involving the rescue of a two maidens in danger (who were, to my relieve, not the usual Damsels in Distress but more than capable of helping themselves), a good old treasure hunt, sea battles with fire and blood and beautiful fighting pirate ladies and a bunch of arrogant and sexist bastards who get what they deserve.
