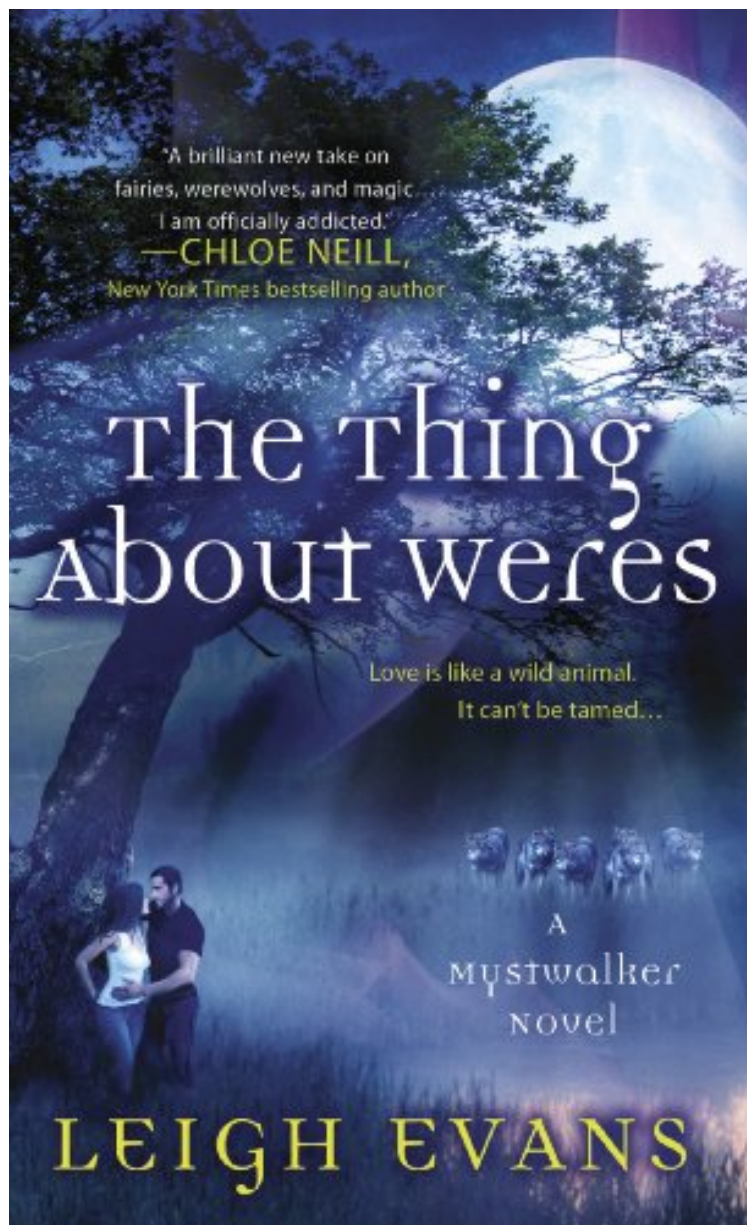

The book starts with Hedi trying to do her job as "Alpha by proxy" in her mate's stead and lead his werewolf pack in Ontario. Problem being that Robson Trowbridge is in Merenwyn, the Fae Realm, where Hedi forcibly brought him, so he could recover from his otherwise mortal wounds. And: Hedi unfortunately has no idea, how to open a portal to Merenwyn and get him back. All this is made worse by the fact that Hedi is half-were and half-fae, unable to shift into her wolf form and - let's face it - does a pretty poor job as Alpha. As in, not doing the job at all, but let others do it for her. Instead, she constantly wallows in guilt, shame and fear of all, but mostly herself. So it's not really a surprise when it all goes down the drain and fast. Unfortunately, I cannot really talk about the ensuing events, because it would be spoiler after spoiler.
